

### 2019 1st Quarter Social Development and Management Program (SDMP) Report

With our steadfast commitment to the sustainable development in our communities, we continuously supportedour stakeholders in our host and neighboring communities with programs, projects and activities that will bring about socio-economic growth and development in our localities through the formulation and consequent implementation of our Social Development and Management Program (SDMP) which is anchored on the following programs:

#### I. DEVELOPMENT OF HOST AND NEIGHBORING COMMUNITIES

#### 1. Human Resource Development and Institutional Building

A training was conducted on "Organic Feeds Formulation using Corn By-products and other Local Ingredients for Livestock and Poultry" sponsored by the Agricultural Training Institute, Regional Training Center 7 last March 5-7, 2019 held at the Demo Farm, Poblacion, Alegria, Cebu. Five (5) Community Relations (ComRel) coordinators and two (2) partners from the community attended the training.









### Enterprise Development and Networking. Cost P 239,155.00

After establishing the Carmen Copper's Integrated Farm, the Copper Mines Agro Venture Organization (CMAVO) has sustained its production. The farm is now the primary source of various high valued vegetable crops such as cauliflower, cabbage, lettuce, carrots and other harvests that are supplied to the local market. The employees of Carmen Copper are ready buyers of the farm's produce, too.







- Assistance to Infrastructure Development and Support Services. Cost P 8,666,412.52
  - A. We built and repaired road networks in our communities for improved access between barangays, which has benefitted the residents especially students and local farmers who need to transport their produce to markets and commercial centers. This has transformed countless lives by unlocking economic opportunities and expanding access to essential services like healthcare and education.

We completed the renovation of the Barangay Health Center at Don Andres Soriano with the provision of latest medical equipment. It will be officially turned over to the barangay very soon.




#### 6. Protection and Respect of Socio-Cultural Values. Cost P218,309.80

#### 7. Use of facilities/services within the mine site. Cost P2,205,011.25




#### Assistance to difference stakeholders in host and neighboring LGU. Cost P730,853.00

# Clean water reaches Toledo hinterlands

Clean and safe drinking water is now accessible to children of Toledo City's hinterlands through the Ultra Filtration Aqua Tower system installed in four elementary schools where access to clean water used to be scarce.

Carmen Copper Corporation made potable water available to pupils of Bagakay Elementary School in Barangay Bagakay, Buswang Elementary School in Barangay Cambang-ug, Magdugo Elementary School in Barangay Don Juan Climaco, Sr. and Old Bucao Elementary Schoolin Barangay General Climaco, all in Toledo City. This project is in partnership with Planet Water Foundation and Xylem Watermark.

It only took four days last March 13 to 16 to install four agua towers by Carmen Copper and Xylem Watermark employee volunteers under the supervision of the Planet Water Foundation nechnical team.

The Aqua Tower does not only provide drinking water for the children, but also encourages them to wash their hands frequently for proper hygiene.

Ultra Filtration Aqua Tower System

The Aqua Tower can produce 10,000 liters of clean water per day that can serve 1,000 individuals. It is more than enough for the population of the school so it can be shared with the rest of the community.

The Aqua Tower is a sustainable water solution

as it does not need power to operate. The only power needed, in few instances, is to pump the water up the holding tank. The pressure, created by the gravity, forces the water from the elevated tank to the ultra filtration system where sediments, bacteria, pathogens, protozoa, viruses and other microbiological contaminants greater than 0.1 micron are

The resulting product is a safe, clean and crystal clear water that passed World Health Organization standards and far superior in quality than well water.

The Aqua Tower features nine faucets around the tower and liquid soap dispensers for hand washing. Volunteers conducted hygiene education to teach

the children the importance of frequently washing their hands to improve their health and prevent the spread of diseases.

It is simple to operate and maintain. Teachers and caretakers were given instructions how to operate and maintain the facility. The Agua Tower can last up to 5 years before the filtration system would need to be replaced. Planet Water Foundation will also conduct regular project monitoring.

Another remarkable feature is its simple, turnkey installation. Volunteers need only about two to three hours to assemble the tower and complete all the piping

der its Social Development and Management Program (SDMP), is committed to help its communities, especially the hard to reach areas, get access to clean water. In 2017, Carmen Copper, in partnership with Planet Water and Xylem Watermark also installed Aqua Towers in PandongBato Elementary School in Barangay Media Once and Biga Elementary School in Barangay Biga.

The project has benefitted not only the school children but also the neighborhood. The Aqua Tower encourages children to come to school without worries of dehydration after a very active day.
