- ❖ As of 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter of 2020, the Community Nursery in Brgy Loay, DAS, Media Once, Biga, Bagakay, Sam-ang, Poog and Cantabaco combined have already produced 285,000 seedlings of forest tress (*Acacia maglum*) which is equivalent to 100 hectares target 2020 reforestation project of the company.





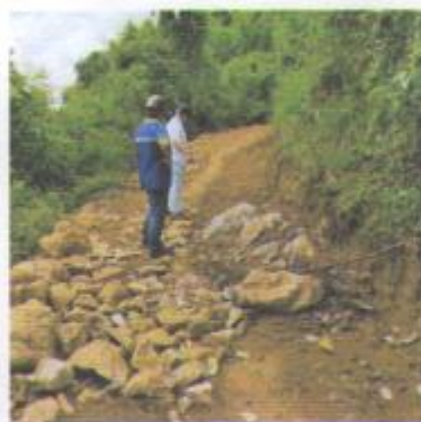
